



After advocacy from Rheem & HTPG seeking answers & clarification, the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) held an online meeting with the industry to discuss the Technology Transition Final Rule reconsideration and their views on enforcement of the current rule. During this meeting, the following items were discussed:

- The EPA has stated that enforcement of the current Technology Transition Final Rule is a “low enforcement priority”
 - Note: This is not a “No Action Assurance” to our impacted products but rather EPA’s stance on enforcing the existing pieces of the current Technology Transition rule being reconsidered
- The EPA confirmed that all current deadlines of the Technology Transition Final Rule, including Remote Condensing Units compliance date of 1/1/2026, are still in effect.
 - New Installations of Remote Condensing Units must utilize a refrigerant with a GWP \leq 300 when system charge is < 200 pounds or utilize a refrigerant with a GWP \leq 150 when system charge \geq to 200 pounds.
- The EPA signaled it intends to extend the compliance dates through the proposed Technology Transition Final Rule reconsideration
- The EPA did not provide timing for the finalization of the Technology Transition Final Rule reconsideration but did signal they will focus their resources on finalization versus enforcement of the current Final rule.
